Information Sheet

Product overview

The EMIS Community Journal View enables clinicians and trusted third party organisations involved in a patient's care to access real-time patient data and displays a 12 month timeline of all encounters and observations made in EMIS Web Community, Children's and Mental Health systems (CCMH) and EMIS clinical services. This dataset is available as an HTML view or structured XML data.

Features and benefits

The Journal view is a single view timeline of observations and encounters including coded and free text information. This could include things such as medications, tests, referral notes and examinations.

Faster, improved decisions

Real-time data ensures that clinical decisions are based on up-to-date information. Having the last 12 months displayed on a single screen provides a great overview.

Enhances the data from the detailed care record

EMIS Community Journal View allows all free text to be displayed which ensures clinicians have the full picture and additional information not just text associated with a code.

Patients tell their story once

EMIS Community Journal View allows the patient's registered GP and everyone involved in their care to see the patient's last year of community data in detail. As a result, care is better co-ordinated which improves patient satisfaction and safety.

Single sign on and a single view saves time

EMIS Community Journal View Data can be seamlessly integrated within the consuming system with a single view of all encounters displayed chronologically - this saves cross referencing different screens, or the need for signing into different systems.

Our portfolio of Specialist Datasets provide additional feeds of real-time patient information and can be used alongside the Detailed Care Record (DCR). External datasets can also feed back into the primary care record.

Case Study

MIG data in Connecting Care supports better, safer care across the Bristol Area

Starting in 2013, the Connecting Care Partnership has brought together a shared care record from across Bristol, North Somerset and South Gloucestershire. Today, it supports 85 GP practices, three community providers, three acute hospitals, a mental health trust and three councils. Connecting Care brings together 20 clinical and social care systems allowing 24 health and care organisations to view the data.

The MIG, from Healthcare Gateway, is a core element of Connecting Care, giving over 6,000 health and care professionals role-based access to primary care and community health records, End of Life Care Plans, clinical letters and correspondence from the three acute hospitals in the region including the EMIS Community Journal View. 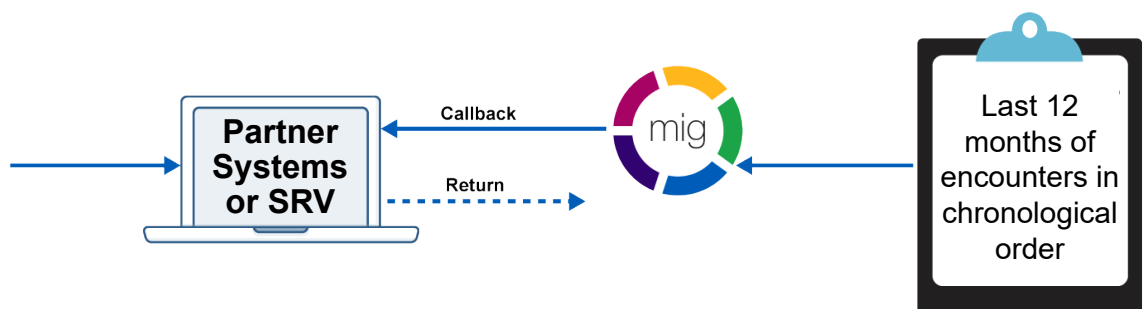

In addition to the Community Journal view, the following 10 views can also be shared from a patient's GP record using the Detailed Care Record. Please refer to the MIG Content Model for further details and information regarding exclusion codes for Detailed Care Record (DCR):

- Summary view including Current Problems, Current Medication, Allergies and Recent tests
- Problem view
- Diagnosis view
- Medication including Current, Past and Issues
- Risks and Warnings
- Procedures
- Investigations
- Examination (Blood Pressure Only)
- Events consisting of Encounters, Admissions and Referrals
- Patient Demographics

As well as the 10 standard views, any additional specialist datasets can also be obtained from a GP organisation.

Often we are missing the back-story of a patient seeing the free text and the last year in this way really helps improve our encounters.
